Amy is the Chair and a Clinical Associate Professor for the Diagnostic Medical Sonography program at the University of Southern Indiana in Evansville, Indiana. She is also a sonographer at Evansville Surgical Associates, Inc. Amy's numerous SDMS committee and volunteer activities began in 2007 with an appointment to the SDMS Government Relations Committee. As a member of this committee, she met with congressional staff in Washington, D.C. to discuss the need to establish

standards and regulation in the sonography profession. In addition to her volunteer work with the SDMS, Amy is also a current member of the curriculum committee, faculty affairs committee, and student financial aid committee at the University of Southern Indiana.

In 1993 a slow day in the radiology department resulted in Amy, a radiologic technology student, developing an interest in the sonography field. "I was sent to observe ultrasound," said Amy. "I knew in an instant that sonography was what I wanted to do, and let's face it, sonography is more fun than barium enema exams." Amy went on to work in several hospitals and offices in the Evansville, Indiana area specializing in vascular and OB sonography for 10 years. In 2004, after working full-time, holidays, weekends and taking call with three small children at home, she decided to apply for a teaching position at a university just minutes from her home. Amy has taught in the Diagnostic Medical Sonography program at the University of Southern Indiana for 16 years now and enjoys teaching students as well as educating sonography professionals.

Amy holds an Associate of Science in Radiologic Technology, Indiana University School of Medicine, Bachelor of Science in Medical Imaging Technology, Indiana University School of Medicine and a Master of Science in Education, University of Southern Indiana. She is the author of multiple publications and webinars including articles published in the *Journal of Diagnostic Medical Sonography* (JDMS) and nursing journals and in 2011 received the second place Kenneth R. Gottesfeld Award for the publication of an outstanding research or review article in the JDMS.
